

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### Bright Futures: Updated Adolescent Recommendations & Resources

- Cervical dysplasia: beginning at the 21 Year Visit
- **Depression**: annually beginning at the 12 Year Visit
- Dyslipidemia: once between the 9 Year and 11 Year Visits and between the 17 and 21 Year Visits
- **Hearing**: once during the Early, the Middle, and Late Adolescence Visits
- Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV): once between the 15 Year and 18 Year Visits
- Oral health: selective fluoride supplementation at the 6 Months through 16 Year Visits
- Tobacco, alcohol, or drug use assessment: administration of an assessment tool at all Adolescent Visits
